You should never get tired of winning the lost.

When Jesus came, His purpose was not to reclaim but **His purpose was to save the lost.**

As true followers of Jesus, you should also have the heart of evangelism like Jesus has.

Christians should have a common vision for a field of mission.

Your vision should always overtake your fear.

People matter to God.

God's ultimately purpose was to bring salvation – to save and to restore the lost.

4 Points about Evangelism

1. God longs to save the lost.

(Luke 15:1) Then all the tax collectors and the sinners drew near to Him to hear Him.

(Luke 15:2) And the Pharisees and scribes complained, saying, "This Man receives sinners and eats with them."

God did not take you out of the problem saturated society but left you in there so you can make a change for the lost.

If people matters to God, what matters to others, matters to us.

God desire all man to be saved and go back to Him.

(1 Timothy 2:1) Therefore I exhort first of all that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and giving of thanks be made for all men,

(1 Timothy 2:2) for kings and all who are in authority, that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and reverence.

(1 Timothy 2:3) For this is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Savior,

(1 Timothy 2:4) who desires all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth.

"All truths in life are base on a pattern supported by a purpose." – Doctor Ed Co

Means everything from the smallest to the biggest contains truth from the Bible. And out of the pattern is seen repeatedly regardless of the situation.

2. God is concern for actual souls.

There must be an actual finding to do evangelism.

Jesus gave an instruction to His people ...

(Matthew 10:14) And whoever will not receive you nor hear your words, when you depart from that house or city, shake off the dust from your feet.

For those who reject the gospel, do not hang around waiting for the same people.

You are people on a mission and race against time.

But you must also respect the freedom of the lost people but you need to share with great urgency.

3. God's primary purpose in sending Jesus is to save the lost.

(Luke 19:10) for the Son of Man has come to seek and to save that which was lost."

(John 3:16) For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life.

Thus saving the lost is Jesus primary purpose. Anything else is secondary.

This teaches you that everything that does not involve evangelism is actually secondary.

Therefore God's primary goal is not to bless you. Not to bless you in your career, studies, relationship, etc. His primary cause is to win the lost.

Having Jesus in your heart means to say that having Jesus as your primary cause.

4. God's primary mission for believers is to win the lost.

So in all your abilities God given to you, does someone actually get save at the end of the day?

You can pray and sacrifice for someone but does someone actually get save at the end of the day?

In all your secondary gettings in life, is to finally support the primary mission of saving.

(John 20:21) So Jesus said to them again, "Peace to you! As the Father has sent Me, I also send you."

Conclusion ...

In God's kingdom, people often miss the main point that God is trying to tell us.

Things you go through in your life, one day you will go back to those things and share it with those who need answers over those that you went through.

God's commission in you will be fulfill if you are able to help those in problems that you have been through before and shared with them.
